### **Young people from Palestine and Israel are saying: Peace between us is possible**

We, young people from Israel and Palestine, took part in a seminar-program, called "Vacation from War" (1<sup>st</sup> till 15<sup>th</sup> of July 2006), organized by the Komitee für Grundrechte und Demokratie in Germany. We came together, because we wanted to know more about the "other side", their feelings and their thinking, the way they look at the conflict and their wishes and visions for the future.

In the weeks before we came to Germany the situation in the Middle East was getting worse and worse. Now, during the first seminar (first two weeks in July), the Israeli Army bombed Beirut and other places in Libanon and in the Gaza-Strip. The Hisbollah and other military organized groups attacked cities and villages in Israel. Many civilians of both sides lost their life or were heavily injured. Some of our participants had to be worried about the life of their parents and relatives.

Reflecting this, after two weeks of working together in the seminar, of living together in the same place, of talking, sometimes even arguing, but also of doing some exciting excursions and other activities, we are more convinced than ever, that there has to be peace in the Middle East and that peace between us is possible. We got more aware and we felt it by talking one with the other, that there is only a future for us, if we think about it as a common future, without fear, without hate and without any violence between us.
